AGM

The AGM will be held on **Thursday March 23 at 7:45 for 8:00** start as usual. The AGM will be voting on updates to the constitution to underline the purpose of the SSRA and reinforce the responsibility of residents to contribute to road maintenance. The proposed constitution accompanies this announcement. The current committee is willing to stand again. However, if anyone else would like to stand please let the committee know.

Neighbourhood Watch

The neighbourhood watch team will give a report at the AGM.

Membership Fees

The road maintenance fee covers the maintenance of our shared roads and soakaways. The maintenance is crucial to:-

- 1. Prevent the council from:
 - a. Withdrawing public services
 - b. Repairing the roads at the householders expense
 - c. Forcing adoption at circa £6,000 per property depending on actual frontage.
- 2. Safety of cyclists and pedestrians.
- 3. Prevent damage to vehicles.
- 4. Maintain property values.
- 5. Preservation of our neighbourhood.
- 6. Provide adequate drainage.

If you receive mail, have your council bins emptied, hold fire insurance, receive home care, have a car or walk then you use our roads.

In addition the SSRA provides other services such as:-

- 1. Neighbourhood watch.
- 2. Whatsapp groups.
- 3. Liaison with the environment agency and council as and when required by the constitution. If you
